MORE BOUNTY LANDS.
BY the Act of Congress passed March 3, 1855, all Officers, Soldiers and Seamen who have served **FOURTEEN DAYS** in any war of the United States since 1775, are entitled to 160 acres

land, if they have not received it. Those who have received 40 or 60 acres are now entitled to enough more to make up the 160. Those who have received 160 acres are not entitled to any more. The benefit of this act extends to the widow and children of the soldier, but not to his heirs. Those who have been engaged in BATTLE are entitled to 160 acres without regard to the period of their service.

Persons having claims under this or any other Act, will have them promptly attended to by calling on or writing to A. J. HARRIS.
