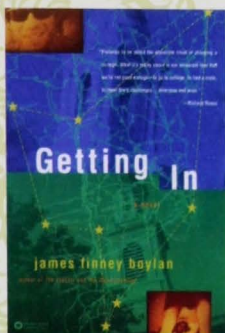

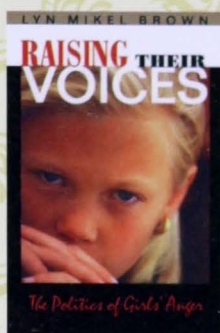
Getting In: A Novel

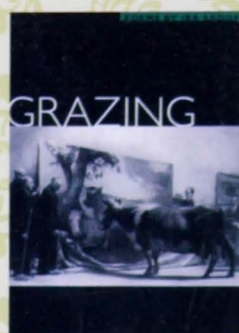
Raising Their Voices: The Politics of Girls' Anger
