The significance of Robinson is made clear in these cogent appraisals of his philosophy, religion, psychology, and sociology; his romantic and realistic manifestations; his aptitudes in specialized verse forms; his short poems, long poems, later poems, poems of the known and the imagined; his characters, male and female; his poetic principles and strategies of practice; his urge toward the novel and the drama; his position in literary history; and the man himself.
