Who's Who: Dr. Susan Allen Toth did some extreme geographical swinging for her three degrees: A.B., east (Smith College), M.A., west (University of California), and Ph.D., mid-west (University of Minnesota). In her publications, however, she has stayed put on the east coast; specifically, female local colorists Rose Terry Cooke, Mary Wilkins Freeman, Sarah Orne Jewett, and now Alice Brown. Ms. Allen has taught at San Francisco State College and is currently assistant professor of English in Macalester College.

N. E. Dunn, assistant professor of English at the University of Maryland, has appeared before on Robinson in *CLQ*, and on Jack London in his eponymous *Newsletter*. A product of Madison College and the University of Pennsylvania, Dr. Dunn was recipient of the F. S. Pepper Fellowship at the latter.

Professor of history at Colby College, Dr. Harold B. Raymond (by way of Black Mountain College and Harvard University) is on a return engagement regarding General Ben Butler in *CLQ*, where he has also discoursed on General Joshua Chamberlain. Raymond has contributed to the *Encyclopedia Britannica* and numerous book reviews to *Choice*.

With baccalaureate from Louisiana State University and doctorate from Johns Hopkins University, David K. Kirby is now assistant professor of English at Florida State University and assistant editor of *Abstracts of English Studies*. He has published essays, poems, and reviews in the *New England* and *South Atlantic* quarterlies, the *Southern Humanities Review*, *Thoreau Journal*, and others.
